Ongoing Research Projects

- 2013 - present *The Military Organization of State Repression.*
 In this project I explore the organizational causes of state repression during counterinsurgency campaigns. Drawing on a variety of data sources, I study how military recruitment, training, staffing, and deployment systems influence patterns of civilian targeting on the macro and the micro level. An integral part of this project is the collection of original data on the military and repression during the Argentina's Dirty War.
- 2014 - present *The Diversity of Non-state Armed Actors in Civil Conflicts: A New Dataset* with Sabine Otto (Uppsala University) and Anita Gohdes (University of Zürich).
 We collect original data on all major armed groups involved in civil conflict between 1989 and 2007. The data set will provide scholars of conflict with extensive and new information on the non-state perpetrators of violence in contemporary conflicts including their formation, their dynamic history of political alignment, and their termination.
